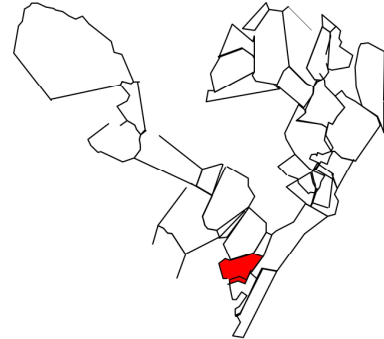


# Abraham Black – 170 acres in Greenbrier County

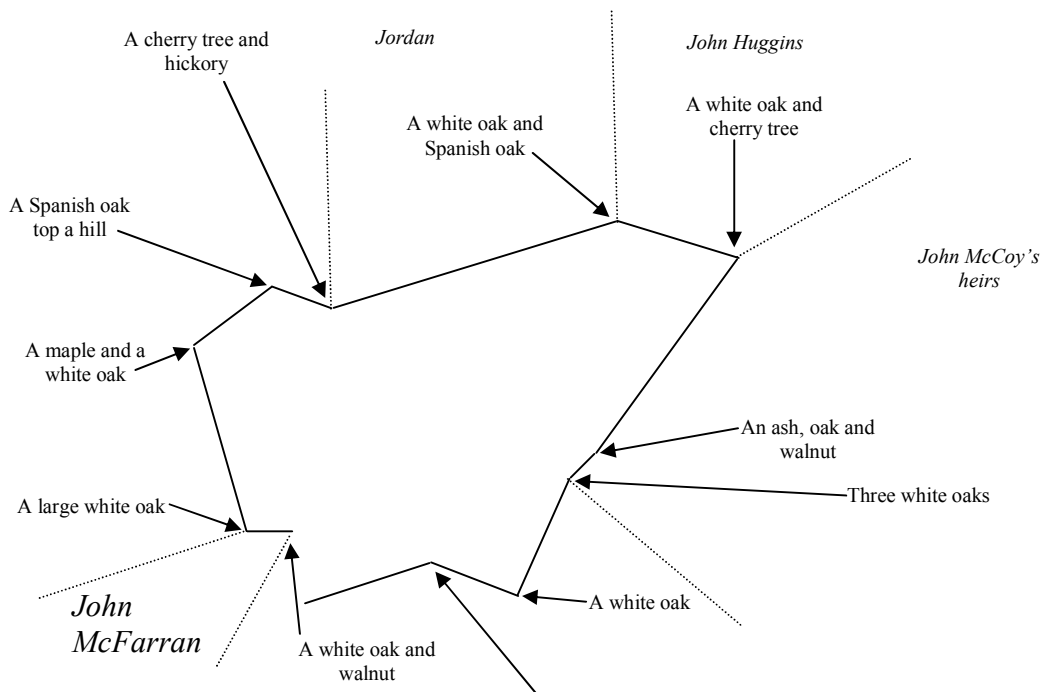

## Description

170 acres in Greenbrier County on the waters of Sinking Creek joining John Huggins, John McFarran, Francis Marra, James Jordan, & John McCoy's heirs

thirty poles crossing Creek to a poplar South Seven Degrees West Twenty poles to  
 a Beech South Eighty Six Degrees West twenty two poles to a maple and spruce  
 North Eighty Degrees West twenty poles to a white oak on the bank of the Creek  
 North Fifty Degrees West thirty Eight poles down the Creek to maple and dog  
 wood a Corner to the Survey said Baker now lives on North forty Degrees  
 West One Hundred and ten poles to an elm on a line of said Survey and South  
 Eighty Six Degrees East Two Hundred and Eighty five poles to the Beginning  
 With its Appurtenances to Have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of Land  
 with its Appurtenances, to the said Michael Baker and his Heirs forever  
 In Witness whereof the said James Monroe Esquire Governor of the  
 Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused  
 the lesser Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond  
 on the Sixteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand  
 Eight Hundred and of the Commonwealth the Twenty fourth

Abraham Black James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of  
 Virginia To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting Know ye that  
 County by Virtue of four Warrants (to wit) Twenty five Acres taken by Land Office  
 Treasury Warrant Number Twelve thousand eight hundred and forty three  
 fifty Acres by Number Fifteen thousand nine hundred and twenty, Ninety  
 One Acres by Number Twelve thousand nine hundred and forty four Acres by  
 Number Twenty two thousand five hundred and Nineteen There is Grant  
 by the said Commonwealth unto Abraham Black a certain Tract or  
 Parcel of Land containing One hundred and seventy Acres by survey  
 bearing date the twenty second day of November One thousand seven  
 hundred and ninety five lying and being in the County of Greenbrier  
 on Waters of Hinting Creek. Witness John Buggins, John M. Ferran  
 Francis Mann, James Jordan & John M. Coys Beers & bounded as  
 followeth.

followeth to wit Beginning at a white Oak and Walnut  
 corner to Huggins and John M. Fennan and with the latter  
 west twenty four poles to a large white Oak corner to Menas and  
 with north sixteen degrees West one hundred and two poles to a  
 maple and white Oak North fifty three degrees east fifty two  
 poles to a Spanish Oak top which South seventy degrees East  
 thirty four poles to a cherry tree & Hickory corner to said Jordan  
 and with Jordan North seventy three degrees East one hundred  
 and fifty eight poles to a white Oak and Spanish Oak corner to  
 said and another survey made for John Huggins & with Huggins  
 South seventy three degrees East sixty eight poles to a white  
 Oak and cherry tree corner said and M. Coy's line & with  
 M. Coy's line South thirty six degrees West one hundred &  
 twenty eight poles to white Oak and Walnut South forty five degrees  
 West Eighteen poles to three white oaks corner to said. — Huggins and  
 with Huggins South twenty four degrees West Sixty eight poles to a  
 white Oak South sixty nine degrees West fifty poles to a poplar  
 South seventy two degrees West twenty poles to the white Oak and  
 Walnut the Beginning with its appurtenances to have and to hold  
 the said tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances to the  
 said Abraham Black and his heirs forever In Witness whereof  
 the said James Monroe Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of  
 Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser seal  
 of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the  
 Twenty fourth day of January in the year of our Lord One thou-  
 sand Eight Hundred and of the Commonwealth the twenty fourth
