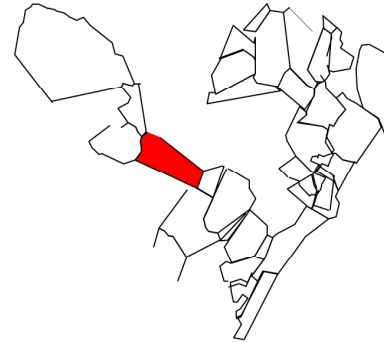


Henry Banks – 360 acres in Greenbrier County

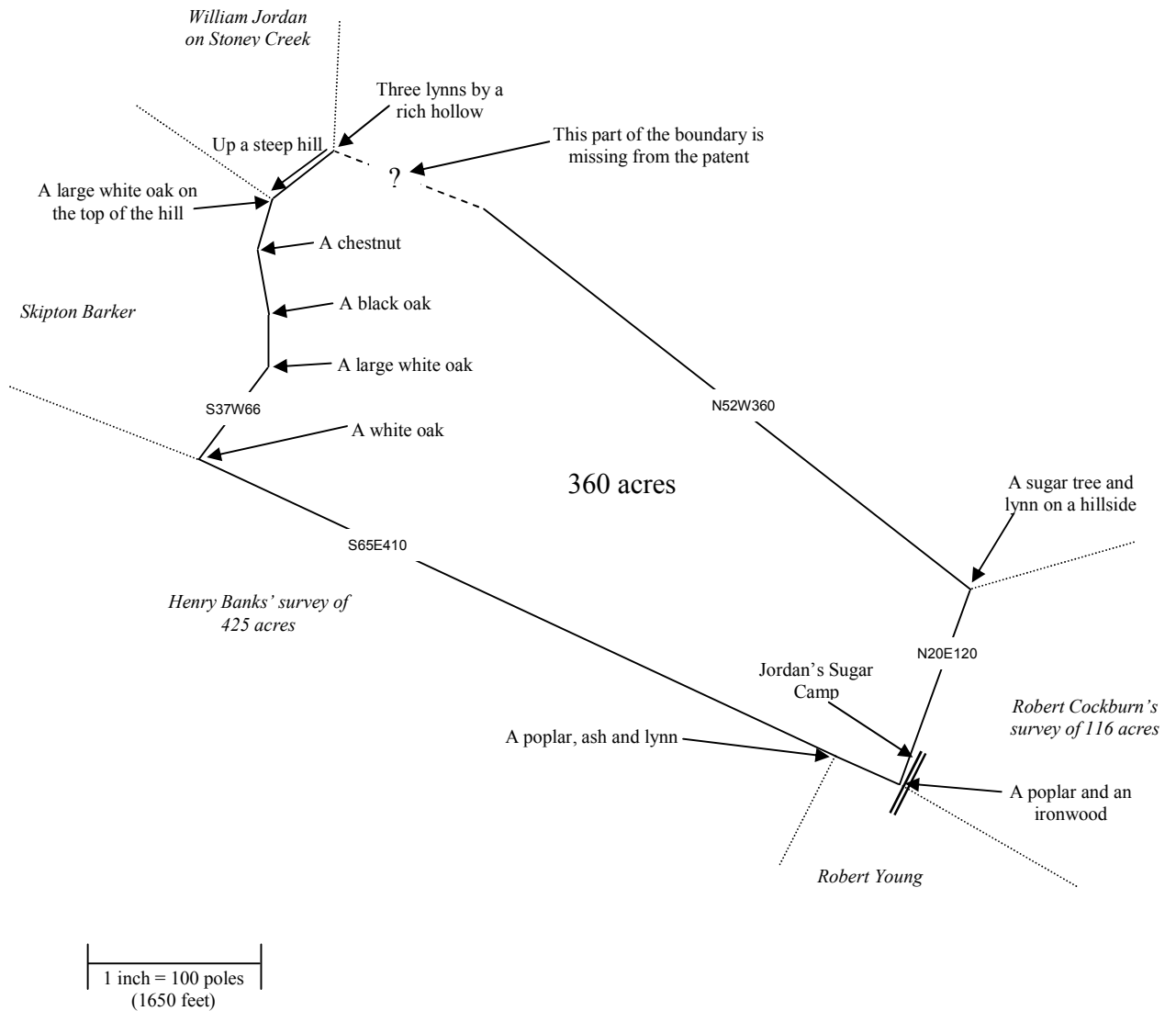
History

Description

360 acres in Greenbrier County joining the land of
 William Jordan, Skipton Barker and a survey of four
 hundred and seventy five acres made for said Banks
 on the land of Robert Cockburn on waters of Sinking Creek



Henry Banks James Wood Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia To all To whom
 360 Acres these presents shall come Greeting Know ye that by Virtue of a Said Office Treasury Warrant
 Greenbrier County Number sixteen thousand and ninety three, issued the eighth day of May one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty three, there is granted by the Said Commonwealth unto Henry
 Banks a certain Tract or parcel of land containing three hundred and Sixty Acres, by
 Survey bearing date the fifteenth day of April one thousand Seven hundred and ninety six
 lying and being in the County of Greenbrier, joining the land of William Jordan, Stephen
 Barker and a Survey of four hundred and Seventy ^{five} Acres, made for said Banks with
 the land of Robert Cockburn, on Waters of Sinking Creek and is bounded as follows
 to wit) Beginning at three Squares corner to Jordan on Honey Creek in a Rich hollow
 and Running the same up a Steep hill South fifty two degrees West forty four poles
 to a large white oak on the top of a hill, corner to the same and Barker and Running
 with Barker South sixteen degrees West thirty poles to a Chestnut, South ten degrees East
 thirty eight poles to a Black oak, South thirty poles to a large ^{white oak}, South thirty seven degrees
 West sixty six poles to a white oak corner to the same and Banks Survey of four hundred
 and twenty five Acres and leaving Barker and Running with Banks South sixty five
 degrees East four hundred and ten poles to a poplar, Ash and Squar corner to the same
 to Robert Young near Jordons Sugar Camp and including same Camp and with
 Young, South sixty degrees East forty poles to a poplar and Iron Wood on said land
 corner to Cockburns Survey of one hundred and sixteen Acres and Running with North
 twenty degrees East one hundred and twenty poles to a Sugar tree and Squar on a hill side
 corner to the same and leaving North fifty two degrees West three hundred and Sixty poles to
 the Beginning with its Appurtenances to have and to hold the said Tract or parcel of land
 with its Appurtenances to the said Henry Banks and his Heirs forever In Witness
 whereof the said James Wood Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia
 hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the said Commonwealth
 to be Affixed at Richmond on the ninth day of September in the year of our
 Lord one thousand Seven hundred and ninety seven and of the Commonwealth
 the twenty Second
