

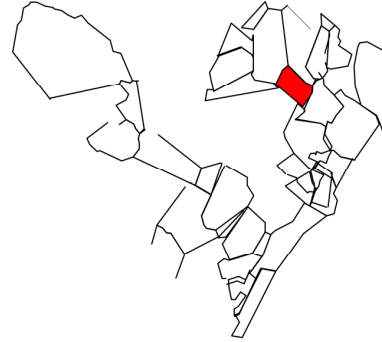

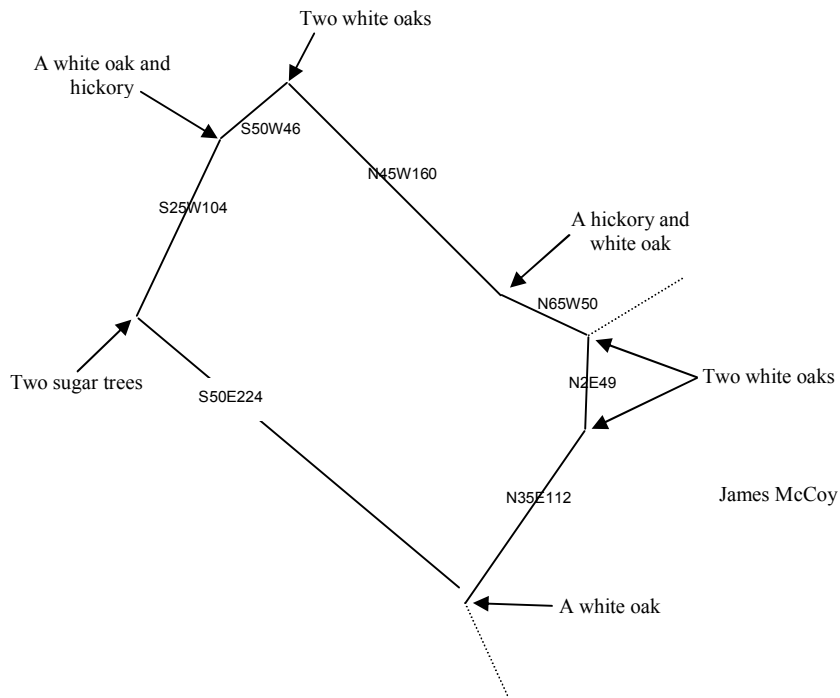

Robert Brooke Esquire, Governour of the Commonwealth of Virginia To all To Whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Know ye that by Virtue of a Certificate in right of settlement given by the Commissioners for adjusting the titles to unpatented lands in the District of Augusta, Botetourt, and Greenbier and in Consideration of the Composition of one Pound Sterling paid by Jacob Chapman into the Treasury of this Commonwealth. There is granted by this said Commonwealth unto Jacob Chapman Assignee of Thomas Llewellyn a certain Tract or parcel of Land Containing. One hundred and Ninety two Acres by Survey bearing date the Eleventh day of May, One thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven Lying and being in the County of Greenbier on a branch of Muddy Creek joining the Lands of James McCay and bounded as followeth to wit, Beginning at James McCay's beginning Corner at a White Oak & with his line North thirty five degrees East One hundred and twelve poles to two White Oaks and North Two degrees East, Forty nine poles to two White Oaks, and thence leaving his line North Sixty five degrees West Fifty poles to a hickory and White Oak and North Forty five degrees West One hundred & thirty poles to two White Oaks and South Fifty degrees West forty six poles to a white Oak and hickory and South Twenty five degrees West One hundred & four poles to two Sugar trees and South Fifty degrees East, Two hundred & twenty four poles to the Beginning with its appurtenances; To have and To hold the said Tract or parcel of Land with its Appurtenances, to the said Jacob Chapman and his Heirs forever.

In Witness Whereof the said Robert Brooke Esquire, Governour of the Commonwealth of Virginia, hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond, on the thirteenth Day of February, in the year of our Lord, One thousand Seven hundred & Ninety five, and of the Commonwealth the Nineteenth
