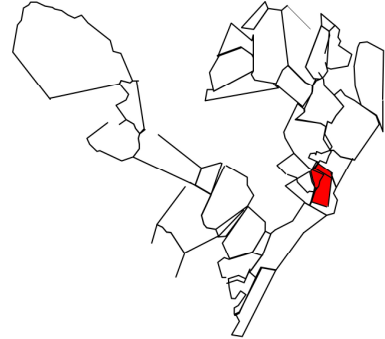


Michael Ocheltree – 150 acres in Greenbrier County

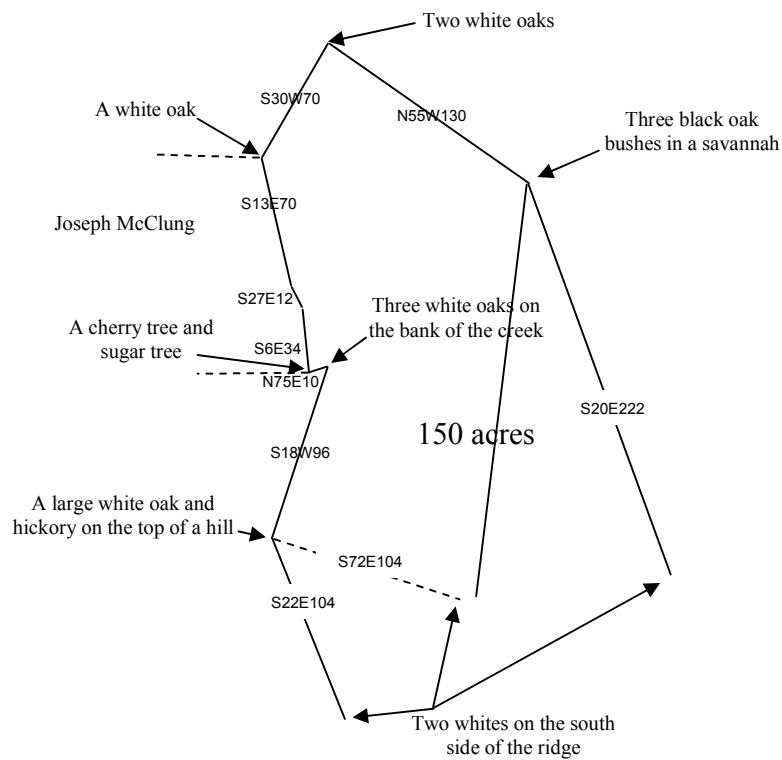
History

Certificate in right of settlement given by the commissioners for adjusting the titles to unpatented lands in the District of Augusta, Botetourt and Greenbrier and in consideration of the ancient composition of 15 shillings sterling
April 12, 1786 Date of Survey
March 28, 1788 Patent signed by Edmund Randolph, Esq., Governor of Virginia. Examined

 the said Edmund Randolph Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of
 VIRGINIA hath hereunto set his hand and caused the lesser Seal of the said
 Commonwealth to be affixed at Richmond on the Fiftieth Day of
 March in the year of our Lord one thousand Seven Hundred & Eighty eight
 of the Commonwealth the Twelfth

Edmund Randolph Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of
 Virginia to all to whom these presents shall come greeting know ye
 That by virtue of a Certificate in Right of Settlement Given by the
 Commissioners for adjusting the Titles to unpatented lands in the
 District of Augusta Botetourt & Greenbrier and in Consideration
 of the Ancient Composition of fifteen Shillings sterling paid by
 Michael Ocheltree into the Treasury of this Commonwealth there is
 granted by the said Commonwealth unto the said Michael Ocheltree
 a certain Tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty Acres
 by Survey Bearing Date the twelfth Day of April one thousand
 Seven hundred and Eighty six lying and being in the County of
 Greenbrier on Sinking Creek and Bounded as followeth To wit
 Beginning at three Blackoak Bushes in a Savanough
 thence North fifty five Degrees West one hundred & thirty

Poles to two white oaks South thirty Degrees West seventy poles
 to a white oak corner to Joseph McBlung near the Creek
 and Down the several Courses of the Same and McBlung's line
 South thirteen Degrees East seventy ~~two~~ poles South twenty
 seven Degrees East twelve poles South six Degrees
 East thirty four poles to a Cherry tree & Sugar tree and leaving
 McBlung's line North seventy five Degrees East ten poles
 to three white oaks on the Bank of the Creek thence leaving
 the Creek South eighteen Degrees West ninety six poles
 to a large white oak and hickory on the Top of a hill South
 twenty two Degrees East one hundred & four poles to two
 whites on the South side of the Ridge thence South
 twenty Degrees East two hundred & twenty two poles to the
 Beginning With its appurtenances to have and to hold the said
 Tract or parcel of Land with its appurtenances to the said Michael
 O'cheltree His heirs for ever In witness whereof the said
 Edmund Randolph Esquire Governour of the Common-
 wealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his hand and caused the
 Great Seal of the said Commonwealth to be affixed at
 Richmond on the Twenty eighth day of March in the
 Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Eighty eight
 and of the Commonwealth the Twelfth
