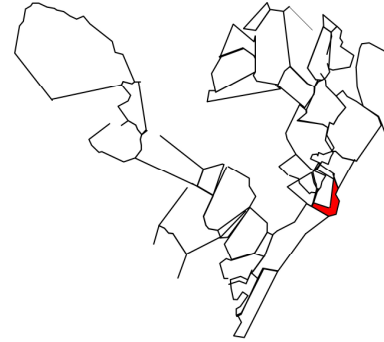


# William McBain, assignee of Robert Young – 100 acres in Greenbrier County

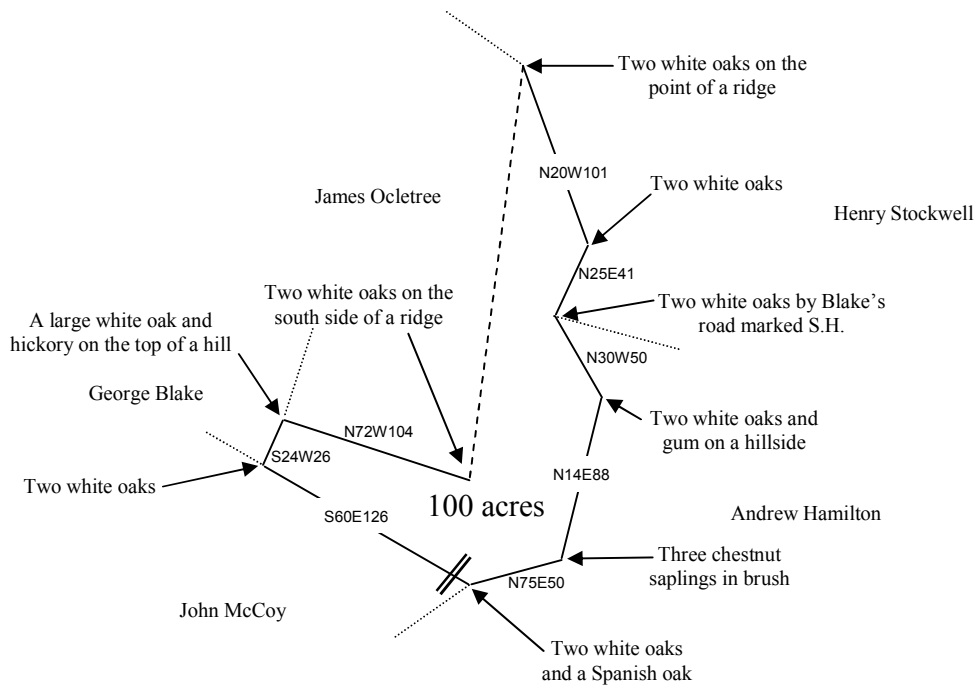
## History

## Description

100 acres in Greenbrier County on Sinking Creek waters and joining the land of James Ocletree and a survey made for George Blake and John McCoy's land Andrew Hamilton and Henry Stockwell including the rise of Sinking Creek

of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety five and of the  
Commonwealth the Twentieth

Robert Brooke Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of  
Virginia To all To Whom these presents shall come, Greeting: I know ye  
that by Virtue of a Land Office Treasury Warrant Number nine thou-  
sand nine hundred and twenty six, there is Granted by the said Common-  
wealth unto William McBain Assignee of Robert Young a certain Tract  
or parcel of Land containing one hundred Acres by Survey by Survey  
bearing date the fifteenth day of February one thousand seven hundred  
and ninety three, lying and being in the County of Greenbrier on Sinking  
Creek waters and joining the Land of James Oeletree and a Survey made  
for George Blake and John McCoy Land Andrew Hamilton and Henry  
Stockwell including the rise of Sinking Creek, and bounded as followeth  
to wit Beginning at two white oaks, on the South side of a ridge corner  
to said Oeletree and running with his line, North seventy two degrees  
West one hundred and four poles to a large white oak and hickory on the  
top of a hill corner to Blake and with his line, South twenty four degrees  
West twenty six poles to two white oaks on McCoy's line and with South  
sixty degrees East one hundred and twenty six poles crossing the Creek  
to two white oaks and a spanish oak, corner to Hamilton and  
with North seventy five degrees East fifty poles to three Chestnut  
saplings in Brush North fourteen degrees East eighty eight poles  
to two white oaks and Gum on a hill side North thirty degrees  
West fifty poles to two white oaks by Blakes road marked J, H, corner  
to Henry Stockwell and with his line North twenty five degrees East  
forty one poles to two white oaks North twenty degrees West one hundred  
and one poles crossing a Savanna and a small ridge to two white  
oaks on the point of a ridge corner to Oeletree and with his open  
line to the beginning With its Appurtenances to have and to  
hold the said Tract or parcel of Land with its Appurtenances  
to the said William McBain and his Heirs forever I W  
Witness whereof the said Robert Brooke Esquire Governor  
of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set his  
Hand and caused the seper Seal of the said Commonwealth

to be Affixed at Richmond on the fourteenth day of Decem-  
ber in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
ninety five and of the Commonwealth the twentieth

Robert Brooke Esquire Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia  
To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: Know ye that by virtue of a Land  
Office Treasury Warrant Number twenty three thousand and seventy three  
issued the twenty fourth day of December one thousand seven hundred and  
eighty three there is granted by the said Commonwealth unto Henry  
Petrick abovesaid, Tract or parcel of Land containing one hundred  
and forty six Acres, by Survey bearing date the twenty sixth day  
of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety four, lying and  
being in the County of Harrison on Hornors run a drain of Boobhs  
Creek and is bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a white  
Oak corner to Land surveyed for (Bellshoyer) Drago, and  
running thence South thirty four degrees East sixty six poles to a  
Poplar, south eighty four degrees West one hundred and thirty  
two poles to a Hickory, North thirty three degrees West fifty three  
poles to a Sugar tree, North thirty five degrees East two hundred  
and twenty two poles to a white oak, South sixty nine degrees East  
one hundred poles to a Poplar, South forty degrees West one  
hundred and fifty four poles to the Beginning. With its Appur-  
tenances; To Have and To Hold the said Tract or parcel of Land  
With its Appurtenances to the said Henry Petrick and his Heirs  
forever. In Witness whereof the said Robert Brooke Esquire  
Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto set  
his Hand and caused the lesser seal of the said Commonwealth  
to be Affixed at Richmond on the Eleventh day of December  
in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and  
Ninety five and of the Commonwealth the twentieth.
