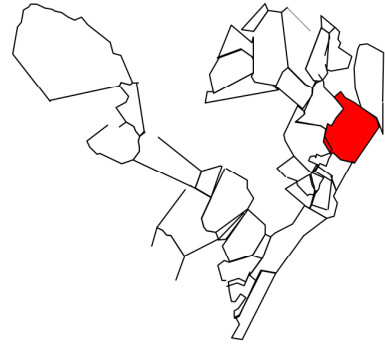

 Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia hath hereunto
 set his hand and caused the lesser seal of the said Common-
 wealth to be Affixed at Richmond on the Twenty ninth
 day of June in the Year of our Lord one thousand
 Seven hundred and eighty seven and of the Common-
 wealth the sixth

 said Commonwealth unto William M Joy a certain Tract or parcel of
 Land containing five hundred and thirty three Acres by survey bearing
 Date the Twenty fifth day of October one thousand seven hundred and
 eighty five lying and being in the County of Greenbrier on siting

Creek and bounded as followeth **Tract Beginning** at three white
 Oaks near a savanna Running North Seventy seven degrees West Ninety six
 poles to a white Oak in a savanna North forty seven degrees West Sixty poles
 to two white Oaks South Eighty eight degrees West Twenty six poles to two white Oaks
 North thirty three degrees East twenty eight poles to a black Oak North thirty degrees
 West Ninety six poles to a white oak North thirteen degrees East Eighty two poles
 to two white Oaks South sixty five degrees East Twenty eight poles to a juniper tree
 North thirty degrees East fifty eight poles to a white Oak North forty degrees
 East Seventy six poles to a white Oak North forty degrees west Ninety six pole to a
 black oak Near the creek North fifty degrees East fifty six poles to two white Oaks
 South Thirty seven degrees East forty six poles to a double white Oak South sixty
 two degrees East sixty eight poles to a white Oak and a hickory South fifty five
 degrees East One hundred and seventy four poles to two white Oaks South
 Twenty degrees East fifty eight poles to three White Oaks South thirty
 five degrees West two hundred and eighty poles to the **Beginning**
